Her research focuses on improving health systems and services for underserved populations, such as racial minorities, people in poverty, and individuals with chronic disability or serious mental illness.

Dr. Agner's work is shaped through ongoing collaboration with community partners and follows principles of community-based participatory research. Her passion for community-engaged scholarship has resulted in numerous publications and awards, including an NIH Career Development Award and a Fulbright Fellowship. "One plus one makes less than two? Consolidation policies and mortality in the Italian NHS"

In this seminar we investigate the population-wide health effects of the amalgamation of local health departments in Italy. We focus on the evolution of municipality-level mortality in the years 2002-2018. We exploit the within municipality variation over time and the staggered adoption of the consolidation reform in different years by using an event study design. Our preliminary findings outline an average increase of the overall population mortality rate, especially in the medium and long-term: an increase of 1.9%, 4-7 years after the consolidation; 2.4% in percentage terms, after 8-10 years. Potential mechanisms are unfolded by considering mortality rates for different age groups, leading causes of death and geographical heterogeneity of the effect.

Prof. Dr. Rinaldo Brau is a full professor in Public Economics at the Department of Economics and Business, University of Cagliari. He is currently serving as Head of Department for the period 2021–2024. He is also a researcher at CRENoS-Centre for North South Economic Research, University of Cagliari and Sassari. He previously completed a PhD in Public Economics at the University of Pavia and worked as a researcher at FEEM-Fondazione Eni Enrico Mattei. He teaches Public Economics in the degree course of Economics and Finance, Welfare State and Regulation in the master's degree in Economics, and Economics of ICT markets in the master's degree in Data Science. His main research interests are in public economics (health economics, welfare evaluation), applied microeconometrics (discrete choice models), environmental and resource economics (environmental policy and natural resource-based tourism) and tourism economics (tourism and growth; tourism preferences and sustainability).

He has over 10 years of industrial experience as Chairman and CEO of the Hellenic Distribution Network Operator (HEDNO) and as executive Vice-Chair and Deputy CEO of the Public Power Corporation (PPC). He was chair and vice-chair of the EU Technology and Innovation Platform on Smart Networks for Energy Transition (ETIP-SNET). He is honorary member of CIGRE and past Chair

of CIGRE SC C6 "Distribution Systems and Distributed Generation". He is Life Fellow Member of IEEE, past Chair of the Power System Dynamic Performance Committee (PSDPC) and Editor in Chief of the IEEE Trans on Power Systems and 2017 recipient of the IEEE/PES Prabha S. Kundur Power System Dynamics and Control Award. He has participated in more than 60 R&D projects funded by the EU Commission, electric utilities and industry for fundamental research and practical applications. He is author of the book "Microgrids: Architectures and Control" and of more than 300 journal publications and 500 conference proceedings papers. He is included in the 2016, 2017 and 2019 Thomson Reuters lists of the top 1% most cited researchers and he is 2020 Globe Energy Prize laureate.
